Sister Nadine Buchanan, OP, has been a Dominican Sister since 1971. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree from Ohio Dominican University, studied Montessori Education at Xavier University, and earned her master's degree from The Ohio State University. Sister also holds a Certification from The National Association of Catholic Chaplains.

Sr. Nadine ministered for 30 years as a primary school teacher in Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, and Connecticut, and at the Dominican Sisters St. Mary of the Springs Montessori school in Ohio.

Sister Nadine began her work in anti-human trafficking in 2009. Although her work in street outreach can be dangerous, she says, "I rely totally on God for my strength and courage.

"My life is fuller because of the work that I do with the women who have survived human trafficking at Freedom a al Cart, the women I meet when I pick them up at the jail, and the women that I encounter in my work on the streets. My purpose in working with these ladies is to sow hope and trust. They have a right to the human dignity that God has given to all of us.

As a Dominican Sister of Peace, I embrace our Chapter Commitment that says, 'To promote justice through solidarity with those who are marginalized, especially women and children, and work with others to identify and transform oppressive systems."








