## **Next Steps in Formation**

May is a month for graduations...for moving from one stage of life's journey to another. At the Dominican Sisters of Peace, we are also celebrating our Sisters in formation as they travel their journeys to religious life. "Formation" is a process of several steps, including study and ministry, that a woman takes on her way to becoming a Dominican Sister of Peace.

Candidates Cathy Buchanan, who entered our House of Welcome in New Haven, CT, in June 2020, and Tram Bui, who entered the Columbus, OH, House of Welcome in December, have been approved to enter the Novitiate. While at the Collaborative Dominican Novitiate in Chicago, they will study at the Catholic Theological Union while continuing to deepen their understanding of Dominican Life and Mission.

After completing her Canonical year at the Collaborative Dominican Novitiate, Sr. Annie Killian will visit the Columbus, OH, community before beginning her Apostolic year of the Novitiate and a two-year Fellowship at Notre Dame University.

Sr. Ellen Coates, who has been ministering as a COVID-19 contact tracer at The Ohio State University in Columbus, OH, as part of her Apostolic novitiate, will profess her first vows later this summer. She joins Sr. Phuong Vu, who took her first vows in December, in this commitment. Sr. Margaret Uche has been approved to renew her temporary vows and will continue her ministry as a home health care nurse in Wichita, KS.

Sr. Ana Gonzalez will make Perpetual Profession this summer. She will continue her ministry as Coordinator of International Admissions at Albertus Magnus College and as an animator with the Vocations Team.
