Sisters Around the World Preaching Peace

In 1956, the Great Bend, KS, community of the Dominican Sisters of Peace founded the Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Siena, Gausau, Nigeria. Their goal was to provide health care, education, and a religious presence in Nigeria, West Africa. With the ongoing support of the Dominican Sisters of Peace through events like the annual Great Bend Bazaar and Raffle, Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Siena, Gausau, have continued to serve the poor and marginalized of Nigeria with health, social services, and educational ministries, touching more than 120,000 persons per year.

Today, the Indigenous congregation, the Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Siena, Gusau, is also part of our peacebuilding efforts. Partnering with the Africa Faith and Justice Network (AFJN), the Dominican Sisters of St. Catherine of Siena, Gusau are working to build peace by reaching out to youth. The one-day youth leadership training workshop "Youth Arise and Shine: You are the Light of the World" offered more than 80 youths training on coalition building, peaceful public action, advocacy, and collaboration. In the weeks since the workshop, the young people who attended have continued to stay in touch through a "WhatsApp" forum and have organized town-hall meetings to highlight the negative impact of drug abuse, alcoholism, rape and female molestation, and youth vulnerability to violence. The Sisters in Gusau were also part of an August seminar on Women Empowerment to combat human trafficking. Religious Sisters from 58 congregations came together to study and to practice advocacy, meeting with the Tanzanian Minister of Home Affairs and local police to encourage more protection from traffickers and more harsh punishment for those convicted of trafficking offenses.

Paulina Ogbonnaya, a Dominican Sister of St. Catherine of Siena, Nigeria, was one of the trainers at the spring workshop. She said her goal was realized because the training kindled a fire in the participants.

"It was like we were waiting for something like this for a long time, and it seems it is coming together now. We are happy because we can see it from the work they started doing after the program," she said.
