

Emmaus Discernment Group

Are you interested in talking with other discerners who are exploring a call to religious life? If so, we invite you to join our monthly discernment group, which we launched this past November. We meet on the second Friday of the month from 7:00pm to 8:30pm EST, both in person at the Columbus Motherhouse and virtually via Zoom with those who can't make it in person because of the distance.

We open and close our meetings with prayer and spend time discussing a topic while offering some reflection questions for sharing or journaling later. Topics have included discernment, community living, prayer, and our relationship with God. This is your group and we are open to whatever topics would be useful to you as you seek to discern God's call in your life.
