She visited St. Mary's Dominican High School to give presentations to seven senior classes. However, it was so much more than that. Students were very open to the opportunity to learn about living out God's call as a vowed religious sister.

Dr. Cindy Thomas, her administrative team, teachers, and staff couldn't have been more welcoming. If you ever happen to be near St. Mary's High School in New Orleans, we invite you to peek inside. Dominican identity and mission are not only taught but they are lived out day-by-day in a very inspiring way. It's "contagious"; no wonder Sr. Bea came back so excited tell all about St. Mary's Dominican High School.

Sr. June Fitzgerald is there this week, along with a few other sisters, for a #NCSW2019 Sister Story event. They will be speaking to the young women about their lives, ministries, and sharing about how they serve in the New Orleans area where God's love is needed the most. Sr. Bea also reached out to <u>Xavier University of Louisiana</u>, and there, too, she was very welcomed and discussed some possible ideas for vocation outreach. This weekend, Sr. June is gving a witness talk about living a vowed religious life as a <u>Dominican Sister of Peace</u> at Xavier.

In addition, Sr. Bea visited the <u>Peace Center</u>, where Sr. Dot Trosclair, OP gave a presentation on "Discerning a Call," from the perspective of discernment as a process of prayer that flows out of a real and continuous union with God in prayer. Sr. Dot also helped attendees reflect on making decisions and she provided techniques for discerning the Spirit.

While in New Orleans, Sr. Bea reconnected with Dominican friars, exchanged conversations about the Dominican family, and discussed possible vocation outreach opportunities with the friars in the near future.

Now Sr. Bea's visit wasn't just an "all-business-trip." She joined several Sisters to visit the Budweiser Clydesdale horses, attended a gala for the <u>Archdiocesan Spirituality Center</u>, and experienced a real Mardi Gras carnival. It was a full week, but she is grateful for the experience.
