Women of the Church Conference by Sr. Mai-Dung Nguyen, OP

The weekend of October 18-20, Sr. June Fitzgerald, OP and Sr. Maidung Nguyen, OP attended the <u>Women</u> of the Church Conference at St. Mary's College in South Bend, Indiana.

Different from the local Catholic women conferences organized by dioceses, this Women of the Church Conference was organized by the Catholic Leadership Women's Conference. Women from different states attended this event. Among the speakers were women holding leadership positions in universities, religious congregations, dioceses, or churches. These women of faith have wide visions and positive attitudes, dare to speak, to dream and to take actions to make the church a better one for everyone. Besides three keynote speaker sessions, there was a panel discussion, a banquet with a wonderful concert, and different breakout sessions covering various topics, such as the history of women in the church, the family, and peace and justice. I attended two breakout sessions about self-balance: "Flourishing in Ministry: Wellness, Restoration, and Essential Relationships" and "Don't Be Weary: Spiritual Practices for Busy Women of Faith." Attending this Women of the Church Conference, I saw myself as a part of a women's movement within the Church to make the church and society a better place to be. She came back very energized as she reflected on her time there: "It was wonderful to be among 'preaching giants' and to reconnect with sisters, nuns, and brothers of our Dominican family. We were encouraged to be immersed in the Word of God and share God's love 'in a way that others know they have encountered Jesus.' (Sr. Megan McElroy, OP) It was so good to learn techniques of evangelization in the way Jesus lived out the mission: through proclamation, witness, dialogue, liberation, encounter, tablefellowship, foot-washing, and crossing boundaries. We also brainstormed ways of fanning and carrying the flame of preaching."


Being Signs of Courageous Hope: Religious Formation Congress 2019 by Sr. June Fitzgerald, OP

Sr. Pat Dual, OP: "Be open, discern with someone who is a mentor or spiritual director, know yourself, your desires and your challenges, what you like and what you dislike. Discern how God connects with you and how you experience God."



Sr. Robin Richard, OP: "Continually ask the Holy Spirit in prayer to guide you - even at difficult times."



Sr. Roosie Loomis, OP: "Find someone, like a spiritual director or any of our Sisters, with whom you can talk about any of your questions. Ask your questions. Pray very hard. Stay with the process, and always trust the result."
